







At least 50% of sexually active men and women get it at some point in their lives.


There is a test for women, but currently there is no approved test for men.







number of new infections of common STIs in one year







- Being diagnosed a STI is a big deal. Listen and offer your support. Be available to have open, honest conversations. In general, be respectful towards them.

- Educate yourself about the STI: what it is, how it is and is not transmitted, how it is treated, and how people can stay healthy with it.

- Some people who are recently diagnosed may find it hard to take that first step to treatment. Encourage them to take care of their health.
